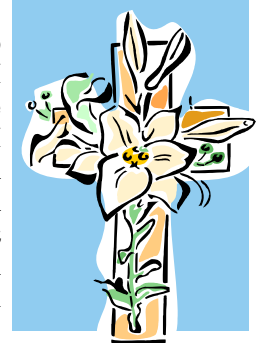

Because He Lives, I've Been Made New!

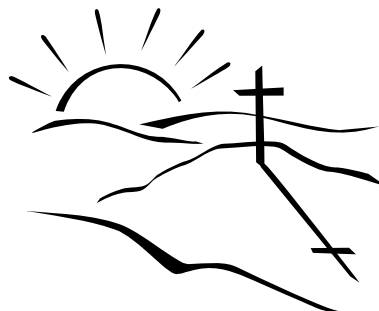
In 1982, I became a new person. My life changed in so many ways my friends from high school were concerned I might be involved in a cult! The cult thing could not have been further from the truth, but I was different. How was I different? I used to live for the weekends and partying with my friends – not anymore. I used to cuss up a storm when my parents weren't around – not anymore. I used to not like church – not anymore. My life used to revolve around me – not anymore. So what happened? How had I been made "new"?



Looking back, God had been preparing me to be made new. My parents raised me to attend church and it was there the Lord planted the seeds of truth that He would water over the years. It's funny how I can't remember much earlier than when I was in the 3rd grade or so. I do, however, vividly remember my mother reading the devotional "Little Visits With God" to my sister and I when I could not have been more than 6 or 7 years of age. A high school classmate and Christian teachers in my secular school all played a role in God making me new. A process was taking place that would eventually culminate.

Spiritual new birth is similar to physical child birth. There's a nine month period of God forming a child in a mother's womb, but then a day comes when the birth occurs. Spiritually, I was made new (born again) when I finally understood my true condition (I'm a sinner in need of savior) and I put my faith in the fact that Jesus is the ONLY solution to this condition. Truly being made new (from the inside out) could not have happened by me just making a decision to change...God had to do it....only He can change a heart of stone into a heart of flesh.

How is all this made possible? How is it God can make people new? In a word – resurrection. Look at what the apostle Peter says:



Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, (1 Peter 1:3 ESV, emphasis added)

This scripture verse directly links Jesus' resurrection to my new birth (being made new)! Because Jesus rose from the dead, He can raise me from my spiritually dead state and breathe His life into me! Oh what a wonderful mystery! It's all because Jesus lives! He's not in the grave!!!

He is Risen !



From the Pastor's Desk: . . . Exodus - Saved for the Glory of God

I'm excited about our next sermon series that will take us through the book of Exodus. Actually, it will be more like three sermon series, because there are three natural segments in the book.

- Exodus Chapters 1-18 The Rescue
- Exodus Chapters 19-24 The Covenant
- Exodus Chapters 25-40 The Tabernacle

In a way, Exodus picks up where the book of Genesis ends. Genesis shows us the beginning of the world and Exodus shows us the beginning of a nation. There are so many parallels and tie-ins between Exodus and the New Testament.

The more I study Exodus, the more I see a theme that shines throughout: God does everything for His glory. God wanted His people set free from bondage, so they would worship Him (Exodus 9:1). Several times God worked in and through the Pharaoh of Egypt so He would be glorified (Exodus 14:4,17-18; 9:16; Romans 9:17). God performed miracles so that He would be glorified (Exodus 15:11). When Moses intercedes for the people of God, he does so by making an appeal to God's glory (Exodus 32:11-14). On and on, it goes throughout the book right to the building of the temple where God is to be glorified through worship (Exodus 29:43)!

Please pray for me as I continue to prepare for this series. Pray for our church as we go through this book of the Bible together. Pray that we would see Him in new and refreshing ways. Above all, pray that God would be glorified through the preaching and through our response to His Word.

April Building Update

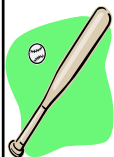
