Keep Alert in Prayer for One Another

I can think of no better activity that we could be engaged in than being in prayer for one another. Within our body of believers, we are having challenges left and right. This week alone I've learned of several friends who have lost their mother or father. There are some who have been months without a job now. The list of challenges could go on and on, but it is suffice to say we need to take one another to God's throne of grace in prayer.

I've been thinking about what the Apostle Paul says in his letter to the Ephesians, "praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints," (Ephesians 6:18 ESV). Paul is teaching several things regarding praying for each other.



* WHEN TO PRAY – "at all times"

How can we pray at ALL TIMES? I believe there are two ways. I think there is first a constant awareness of God's working in every situation. If we are "God-conscious", then we'll be talking to God regarding one another's needs. Secondly, there is virtually no situation into which we should invite the Lord to move and work in each other's lives.

* HOW TO PRAY – "And pray in the Spirit"

As we are driven to pray, we ought to pray as the Holy Spirit directs us to pray about the situation. If we let Him, the Spirit will often direct our course of prayer for someone. He takes our knowledge of our friend and His supernatural insight about their need and somehow melds them into a heartfelt prayer.

* WHAT KIND OF PRAYER – "with all prayer and supplication"

We should pray all kinds of prayers for one another. As long as the prayers don't contradict what God has stated as His will in His Word, then the sky is the limit. We are to pray prayers of healing, prayers for help, prayers for His provision in a situation, prayers for sanctification, etc.

* WHO TO PRAY FOR – "making supplication for all the saints"

When it comes to our church body, don't just pray for your closest friends. Lift up the needs of those who send their email prayer requests. Pray for your Small Group members as they share their needs in the context of your group. Pray for all the saints!

* DON'T STOP – "keep alert with all perseverance"

Don't give up praying for your fellow brother or sister in Christ. They need your intercession. When you sense a prompting to pray, be on the alert and do it right then and there.

May the Lord move us all to be obedient to His call to pray for one another. May we grow in being effective prayers for God's purposes and for His glory. Amen.

From the Pastor's Desk: . . . Doctrine, Who Needs It?

To give a short answer to the above question: We do.

Alright, I guess I need to explain. Recently, I informed our Leadership Team that this coming 2010-11 ministry year, we would be studying some systematic theology together during our regular team meetings. In doing so, we'll be studying various key doctrines like...

- * the doctrine of the Word of God (it's authority, necessity, inerrancy, and sufficiency)
- * the doctrine of God (His attributes, the Trinity, etc.)
- * the doctrine of Man (his creation, sin, etc.)
- * the doctrine of Christ (person of Christ, atonement, resurrection, ascension, etc.)

...and the list goes on to some twenty key doctrines of the Bible. Why study theology systematically (topically)? Because it helps us see what the **WHOLE** Bible says on some key truths. If we only look at certain verses or certain books of the Bible, we may get an incomplete view of who the Holy Spirit is or what the purpose of the Church is to be, etc. However, if we engage in a more complete study of a topic, we will be better equipped to minister to those around us and we might just jettison some unbiblical thinking on our part.

The purpose in undertaking this type of study and reading is to grow in our knowledge of God and His will for us. The end result should be praise, wonder, and obedience. All of which bring glory to God. If you are interested in growing in this area, I would recommend a good read that takes you through some of these key doctrines: Bible Doctrine, by Wayne Grudem (ISBN 978-0310222330). You don't need to a degree in theology to understand that book either. When I read these kinds of books, they drive me right to the Bible to look up the scriptures for myself. They help build my convictions. Don't we all need that? Who needs doctrine? We all do.

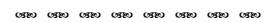

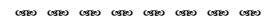

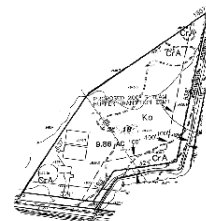
