Creation and Evolution

It is not that the methods and institutions of science somehow compel us to accept a material explanation of the phenomenal world, but, on the contrary, that we are forced by our a priori adherence to material causes to create an apparatus of investigation and a set of concepts that produce material explanations, no matter how counter-intuitive, no matter how mystifying to the uninitiated. Moreover, that materialism is an absolute, for we cannot allow a Divine Foot in the door.”

Creation Model:

This ranges from those who take Genesis literally to teach that in six days God made a mature and fully functioning universe in which living things would reproduce after their own kind. This is known as “Scientific Creationism.” There are also those who have a looser interpretation of Genesis (maybe not even believing it at all) but believe there is overwhelming evidence for a Creator. This is called the “Intelligent Design” theory.

Evolution Model:

Naturalistic evolution claims that all the diversity of life now on the earth is the result of mutations, natural selection, and other random processes gradually changing over millions of years. Many people who believe in God try to make the Bible fit with evolutionary theory, claiming that “God caused evolution to happen.” This is called “Theistic Evolution.”

1. The Bible is the Most Unique Book Ever Written

Questions Posed by the *New Atheists*

Inspired by the likes of Richard Dawkins and Christopher Hitchens, the “New Atheists” attack the Bible as a book advocating

- Hatred of homosexuals
- Oppression of women
- Ownership of slaves
- Genocide of non-Jewish peoples.

There are 31,103 verses in the Bible. To emphasize about 10 of these verses taken out of their Old Testament context in order to portray the Bible in this way really is both evil and fundamentally dishonest on a very deep level. People who do this display arrogance by judging God and His Word which is simply astounding.

Jesus told us that God reveals spiritual truths to those who come to Him with a humble, trusting, childlike attitude and that He hides his truth from arrogant know-it-alls (Matthew 11:25-27). Therefore, it is almost always futile to argue, debate or even discuss these verses with someone who has such a proud attitude. It is also incredibly dangerous and foolish to allow such a person to teach you the Bible (e.g. a Survey of the Bible course in college).

Wisdom Insight: When you talk to someone who has a terribly distorted and evil view of God, it tells you something about that person. Psalm 18:25-26 tells us:

*With the kind You show Yourself kind;
with the blameless You show Yourself blameless;
With the pure You show Yourself pure,
and with the crooked You show Yourself astute.*

Therefore, when talking with such a person, seek to discover and focus the discussion on the real reason for their twisted understanding. Discover their sin issue, call them to repentance and show them how they can find salvation and new life in Jesus Christ. This is the true message of the Bible and this addresses the real need in their life.
