

### Job 40:6-14 (NLT)


7"Brace yourself like a man, because I have some questions for you, and you must answer them.

# God uses the example of two uncontrollable creatures to teach Job





### Job 40:15-19 (NLT)

<sup>15</sup>"Take a look at Behemoth, which I made, just as I made you. It eats grass like an ox.







<sup>17</sup>Its tail is as strong as a cedar.
The sinews of its thighs are knit tightly together.







<sup>19</sup>It is a prime example of God's handiwork, and only its Creator can threaten it.



### Job 40:23-24 (NLT)

<sup>23</sup>It is not disturbed by the raging river, not concerned when the swelling Jordan rushes around it.





<sup>24</sup>No one can catch it off guard or put a ring in its nose and lead it away.







<sup>1</sup>"Can you catch Leviathan with a hook or put a noose around its jaw?





<sup>2</sup>Can you tie it with a rope through the nose or pierce its jaw with a spike?









<sup>5</sup>Can you make it a pet like a bird, or give it to your little girls to play with?







### Job 41:1-11 (NLT)

<sup>8</sup>If you lay a hand on it, you will certainly remember the battle that follows.

You won't try that again!





<sup>9</sup>No, it is useless to try to capture it. The hunter who attempts it will be knocked down.

<sup>10</sup>And since no one dares to disturb it, who then can stand up to me?





<sup>11</sup>Who has given me anything that I need to pay back?

Everything under heaven is mine.

<sup>5</sup>I had only heard about you before, but now I have seen you with my own eyes.




## Job 42:1-6 (NLT)
