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# Devoted to the Breaking of Bread Acts 2:42; 1 Corinthians 11:17-34



# Acts 2:42 (ESV)

<sup>42</sup>And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.



<sup>17</sup>In the following directives I have no praise for you, for your meetings do more harm than good.



<sup>18</sup>In the first place, I hear that when you come together as a church, there are divisions among you, and to some extent I believe it.



<sup>19</sup>No doubt there have to be differences among you to show which of you have God's approval.



<sup>20</sup>So then, when you come together, it is not the Lord's Supper you eat,



<sup>21</sup>for when you are eating, some of you go ahead with your own private suppers. As a result, one person remains hungry and another gets drunk.



<sup>22</sup>Don't you have homes to eat and drink in? Or do you despise the church of God by humiliating those who have nothing? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you? Certainly not in this matter!



<sup>23</sup>For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread,



<sup>24</sup>and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me."



<sup>25</sup>In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."



<sup>26</sup>For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.



<sup>27</sup>So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord.



<sup>28</sup>Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup.



<sup>29</sup>For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves.



<sup>30</sup>That is why many among you are weak and sick, and a number of you have fallen asleep.



31But if we were more discerning with regard to ourselves, we would not come under such judgment.



<sup>32</sup>Nevertheless, when we are judged in this way by the Lord, we are being disciplined so that we will not be finally condemned with the world.



<sup>33</sup>So then, my brothers and sisters, when you gather to eat, you should all eat together.



<sup>34</sup>Anyone who is hungry should eat something at home, so that when you meet together it may not result in judgment. And when I come I will give further directions.

# The Importance and Purpose of the Breaking of Bread in the life of the church



# 1: It is a Symbol of the Unity of the Church (vss. 17-22)



# 1 Corinthians 11:18 (NIV)

<sup>18</sup>In the first place, I hear that when you come together as a church, there are divisions among you, and to some extent I believe it.

# 1 Corinthians 11:26 (NIV)

<sup>26</sup>For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.



# Matthew 26:29 (NIV)

<sup>29</sup>I tell you, I will not drink from this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom."



# 4: It Provides an Opportunity for Regular Spiritual and Moral Examination (vss. 27-34)



# **1 Corinthians 11:27-28 (NIV)**

<sup>27</sup>So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord.



## **1 Corinthians 11:27-28 (NIV)**

<sup>28</sup>Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup.



21"You have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'You shall not murder, and anyone who murders will be subject to judgment.'



<sup>22</sup>But I tell you that anyone who is angry with a brother or sister, will be subject to judgment. Again, anyone who says to a brother or sister, 'Raca,' is answerable to the court. And anyone who says, 'You fool!' will be in danger of the fire of hell.



<sup>23</sup> Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother or sister has something against you,



<sup>24</sup>leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to them; then come and offer your gift.
